Matters Arising

[1] Police Matters

PCSO Daisy Deveraux attended the meeting, and spoke in general terms, no issues of concern were apparent in the community.

[1.1] Road leading up and past Betws Motors/Road Sign Unsuitable for Heavy Vehicles

The clerk reported that disappointingly no further information had been received from Conwy CBC.

[1.2] Traffic Issues Pont y Pair Bridge/Coed Cynhelir Road

The clerk referred to correspondence Conwy CBC requesting a financial contribution towards a new CCTV camera to monitor activity on the bridge etc. Clerk to seek further information regarding monitoring & response etc.

[1.3] Chip Shop

Noted disappointingly that the fridges had not been removed from below the bridge. Clerk to write requesting their removal.

[1.4] Planning Matters

Construction of dwarf retaining wall and amendments to rear balcony and access stair.

[1.6] Swallow Falls Admission Charges

Following a recent meeting with Lady Willoughby and Mr A Hall the estate manager, the clerk reported that the estate was now recommending that the admission charges be increased to £2.00 for adults and 1.00 for children under fourteen.

Resolved to approve an increase to £2.00 for adults but that children under fourteen should remain at £0.75

[1.7] Sewage leak to the river Llugwy

The clerk referred to a letter from Ms Karen Ann Jones regarding sewage spilling to the river Llugwy on Sunday 2th May 2018. Noting that the problem had been apparent for some considerable time, clerk to request representation from Welsh Water at the next meeting of the Community Council.

[1.8] Hedge Coedcynheir Hill

Clerk to request that the hedge on Coedcynhelir hill be cut back to improve visibility for motorists.

[1.9] National Eisteddfod of Wales Llanrwst 2019

Noted that the Gwydyr Estate had given a generous contribution towards the event and also Betws-y-Coed Tourism Association. Gwawr Jones explained that the fund raising committee had sent a letter to all households within the community requesting a contribution and that the fund at present was considerably short of its target.
